## Shingle Licence Coromandel County : Mellsops

1. Mellsop's Crossing was the name of the crossing of the Urarimu Stream before the present road bridge was built. The foreshore on the seaward side of the adjacent road reserve is private property to H.W.M. The map is not correct in that it shows the 'area of removal' extending northwards along the foreshore in private property on shingle beds above H.W.M.
2. The Urarimu Stream mouth periodically blocks with the build-up of shingle that changes the outlet to the sea as marked in pencil dashes or forms a temporary lagoon as shaded in pencil on the attached plan.
3. Previous approval was given to the Coromandel County to remove 2000 cubic yards of shingle per annum from the tidal channel and mouth of the Urarimu Stream. Renewal of the licence under the same conditions is recommended.

Refer my minuted copy of 4/5/73 to Messrs Miller and Poulgrain, Solicitors, acting for the complainant Mr G.F. Geard, refers.

Please find enclosed a photocopy of the report obtained from The District Commissioner of Works.

It would appear that on consideration of this report, and of the letter from the Engineer, Coromandel County Council in reply to my enquiry of 4/5/73, that any erosion caused to Mr Geards Property is caused by the removal of shingle from above mean high water ordinary spring tide mark the fact that <sup>slow</sup> removals allows temporarily the tide to reach higher up river should not be a responsibility of this Ministry especially as water movement at the extreme extent of the tidal rise would not likely be of great force.

It would be of interest to know if other authorities who issue removal permits for sand and shingle from streams obtain reports prior to issue, to ensure that removals will not cause erosion.

Please advise if a reply to the Solicitors should come through this office or at Head Office level.

Whangarahi Stream

Your 47/16 of 10 May refers.

1. Removal of shingle in the Coromandel area takes place under two different permits, one being the Marine Division permit for taking shingle from the tidal reaches of the Whangarahi Stream and the other being a blanket permit from the Department of Lands and Survey for removal of sand and shingle from streams above the tidal area. Under the latter, shingle could be taken from either the Whangarahi or from either of its two tributaries, the Karaka Stream and the Hauraki Valley Drain.

Some confusion arises when the removal of shingle from an area which was above M.H.W.M. results in the bed of the stream being lowered and hence the tidal influence moves further upstream. The initial removal would be under the Lands and Survey permit but it might be that any further removal would then come under Marine <sup>Division</sup> Department control.

2. Something of this nature has occurred on the Whangarahi. Although the limit of tidal action was never clearly defined it was generally taken to be near the boundary of Mr Geard's property. Above this there was a substantial bank of shingle stretching from the boundary, past the confluence of the Hauraki Valley Drain and up to the junction of the Karaka Stream, a distance of 130 yards approximately. This would have been considered to come under the control of Lands and Survey.

3. Mr. Keegan inspected the area on 17 May and found that the shingle bank mentioned in (2) had been worked recently. As a result the tidal influence now extends to include this area.

He reports that there is no damage to the farmlands in this vicinity, the only area of 'ground' that has been lost being the shingle bank itself. In any case, the area concerned is only of the order of half-an-acre whereas Mr. Geard is reported to have claimed damage to two acres.

Mr. Keegan is therefore of the opinion that working of the Marine Division permit has in no way caused damage to Geard's property.


However, as the Whangarahi Stream bed has been largely cleared of shingle and the bed level considerably lowered it may be as well that further removal of shingle below M.H.W.M. be prohibited until the stream replenishes itself, i.e., the Marine Division permit could be cancelled in the meantime.

One of the reasons for recommending the removal of shingle from the tidal reaches of the Whangarahi was that house properties adjacent to the stream were suffering flooding. The removal done to date has, I think, cured this problem for the meantime. If it re-occurs then it may be desirable to remove further shingle, and a fresh permit would need to be issued.

5. It may be that there is erosion somewhere in Geard's property, away from the area inspected by Mr. Keegan. If this is so, it may be natural or it may be contributed to by removal of shingle further upstream, under the terms of the Lands and Survey permit.

I would need to have more specific details of where the erosion is supposed to have occurred to be able to check on this. However, this would appear to in no way concern the Marine Division.

The quantity of metal removed recently is as follows:

1/1/73 - 1/5/73	700 cu. yds removed from just below confluence of Whangarahi and Karaka Streams
1972	100 cu. yd removed from below Furey's Bridge.


Since the removal of this metal no erosion has taken place along the banks of this stream. When the metal was removed the level of the stream bed was not significantly altered but a fairly large bank of metal in the middle of the stream bed was removed. Some of the metal was used to improve the shape of the stream bed and a considerable quantity was pushed up against the banks of the stream in an effort to give them additional protection.

The history of this complaint stretches back over some 15 to 20 years. During this period a considerable amount of work has been carried out in both the Whangarahi and Karaka Streams (by both Council and others) which included shingle removal, stop banking, bank protection, channel clearing and a small stream diversion. Erosion has also occurred in this period but it cannot be attributed to any one single act of the Council or other person if in fact it can be attributed to any of the works. Erosion is a natural phenomenon which takes place in all streams to some extent and it is impossible to state that the erosion would have been more, or less if the works had not been carried out.

Mr Geard has made similar complaints in the past which have been fully investigated by the council and it has not been shown that erosion has resulted from Council works.

I do not know where the erosion that is the subject of this complaint is, but I suspect that it may stretch over some 2 miles of stream. I also think that it has not occurred at any one time but is an accumulation over a period of years.

The solicitors, Millar & Poulgrain, acting for Mr G.F. Geard have inferred that the removal of shingle under licence has caused erosion and state:-

"We act for Mr G.F. Geard who owns land adjoining the Whangaraki Stream. Your department has granted the Coromandel County a licence to remove metal from the bed of the stream. Our client claims that as a result of the removal of the metal his property has suffered damage, and we would be pleased if you would notify the Coromandel County that no further metal is to be removed until such times as adequate steps are taken not to cause any damage to our client property and that the damage already suffered is remedied.

The damage that our client has suffered is erosion to his land. He claims that he has lost 1 to 2 acres of land.

A telegram has been sent to the Coromandel County Council instructing that removal cease and a letter explaining the reason will be sent.

The details are:-

The Ministry of Works with their 47/16 of 24/1/73 recommended that a permit for 5,000 cubic yards of shingle could be issued for the Whangarahi Stream and noted "the Whangarahi Stream may be a little optimistic, but the quantities available will depend on the amount of shingle mould down by the Whangarahi and Karaki Streams".

Due to the lack of rain since November 1972, it may be that the expected deposits did not occur.

Permit No. 2467 was issued on 25/1/73 permitting a removal of 5,000 cubic yards per annum and it could be that lack of Council supervision in extractions has caused damage.

You will be kept advised of the report and recommendation of the Ministry of Works.

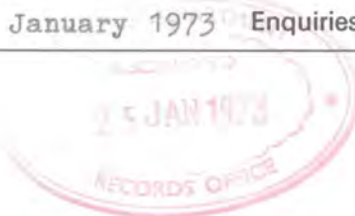



Persuant to Council's resolution 711/71 I have inspected the tidal outlet of the Whangarahi Stream from the viewpoint of report<sup>ed</sup> erosion of the banks due to the removal of shingle.

In my opinion erosion ~~has~~ not endangered the Hauraki Roadside or retaining wall to any great degree, but there is some need to control the depth of the channel and I would recommend that any licence granted for the removal of shingle should stipulate that the shingle deposit should be skimmed to a depth of 12 inches or so and not completely removed to mud level.

Too much shingle deposit will restrict the free flow of water but the stream bed should be allowed to remain at the present level so that undercutting of the banks will not occur in flood time.

On the 12th April, 1966, you requested an increase of your permit to remove 100 cubic yards per month from Papa Aroha Stream. As you know an investigation was carried out at the time and it was found that an increase was not possible.

However, the position has been reviewed again. The following is an extract of Ministry of Works report on the area concerned :-

"I now recommend that the removal of shingle be restricted to the tidal area of the stream shown in Yellow on the attached sketch. The seaward limit of excavation would be a line from the Pohutukawas on the North head land to the posts on the South side of the stream mouth.

There is about 800 to 1,000 c. yds of shingle available now from the area specified. If removed it will be replaced by river shingle deposited by floods and beach shingle swept into the stream mouth by tides and westerly storms.

The shingle beach spur on the South side of the stream mouth has built up and remained stable over the last 12 months. I consider no shingle should be removed from this area, above or below tide level, without special permission. Removal of this shingle appears to result in it being replaced by shingle from further south along the beach with resultant erosion of the grassed bank at the edge of the beach."

REMOVAL OF SHINGLE: TOKOTAREA AND GOAT BAYS

Reference your minute on letter 14/7 5.8.1 of 2 May to  
Coromandel County Engineer.

My Resident Engineer at Paeroa has reported that the removal of shingle at Goat Bay does not appear to have caused any damage. The removal of a limited amount of shingle per annum would probably be acceptable. The beach is a small one and the total amount of shingle available restricted. I am not able to say, at this stage, what the rate of renewal would be. I therefore recommend that the amount of shingle removed should be restricted to 300 cubic yards per annum and that the situation be reviewed at the end of 3 years.

There has been some confusion regarding the location of Melsopp's Crossing. The County Engineer described this as being on the Hope Stream but in fact, it is on the Urarimu Stream. There are large quantities of shingle in this area and I think that a permit could be issued for removal of 500 cubic yards per annum from below H.W.M. without fear of damage resulting.

Dear Sir,

The Wangarahi Stream enters the Coromandel Harbour at Furey's bridge within the Coromandel County Town. During wet periods this stream floods extensively, and on occasions, houses in Hauraki Road are inundated. Damage to private property and Hauraki Road, due to flooding, could be eliminated by dredging the shingle from the stream bed and thus deepening the water-way. The shingle is carried down from higher levels where considerable bank erosion has occurred in farmland.

In my opinion the removal of shingle from the stream bed for approx 20 chains upstream of Furey's bridge and immediately below the bridge would have no detrimental effect on the farmland; although this claim has been made in the past. The stream is navigable and is used by small sea-craft.

I understand an Officer of your Dept arranged with Mr. Vickerstaff for an engineering inspection to be made to determine what effect removal of shingle from the lower reaches would have on the farmland above.

Herewith, I make formal application to remove shingle from the tidal section of the Whangarahi stream bed. The shingle would be used mostly for foreshore reclamation along Wharf Road. Any suitable shingle would be used for local road construction provided sufficient quantities were available for economic crushing.

Your minute 14/4/1 of 7.4.66 refers.

1. The above beach was inspected by my Resident Engineer on 20.4.66 in the company of Mr Gilmore who wishes to remove the shingle. Since this beach was inspected last on 26.5.64 Mr Gilmore has bought 7 acres of land which was previously owned by Mr McCall (who had expressed opposition to the taking of shingle in the past). This land is the flat area on the south of the beach referred to in previous correspondence.

2. The following points were observed since the last visit almost 2 years ago.

(a) Shingle at the creek outlet had built up to approximately the same level as when the beach was inspected on 20.12.63. Most of this shingle is obviously beach shingle and has not come down the stream but has been transported there by the Littoral Drift.

(b) At the south end of the <sup>bay</sup> ~~bay~~ there used to be a distance of up to half a chain between the fence and the sea. There is now quite a length over which the sea has eaten its way back almost to the fence line.

(c) There is little doubt that the quite large quantity removed from the mouth of the stream in 1964 has been replaced by shingle from the south end of the beach. The gravel transported by this stream is of quite different appearance to the well rounded beach shingle and the amount transported is relatively small.

(d) To some extent the build up of shingle at the mouth of the stream does obstruct the free flow of the stream. However it appears that removal of this obstruction results in erosion of the beach further south.

3. Mr Gilmore is aware of the dangers of removing shingle from the beach as he has now lived there for almost 2 years. As it is his land (and livelihood) that is threatened if shingle removal is abused he is watching developments carefully and wants to remove 100 yards himself over a period of several months.



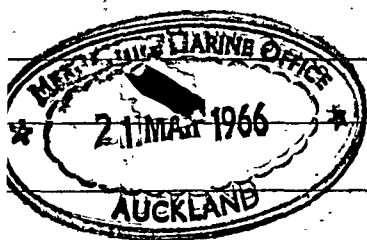

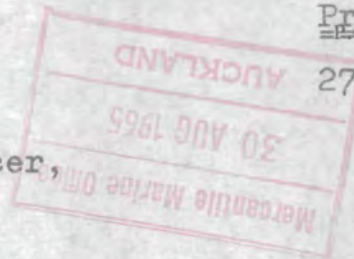

1. Your memorandum dated 21 May 1965. I believe the applicant wants the shingle for metalling an access track.
2. There are several other access tracks in the immediate vicinity. If a permit is granted for one case there will no doubt be a demand from other owners (or a tendency for them to think that a precedent has been established, and shingle can be taken at will).
3. The best shingle is on the portion of the beach subject to erosion from wave action. This shingle should not be touched.
4. On other parts of the beach poorer shingle is available and a small quantity could be taken without damage resulting.
5. Due to the isolated locality it would be difficult to control the amount taken or the locality it is taken from.
6. In spite of the fact that the removal of 40 yards would not cause damage if properly controlled I think the other considerations outweigh this. I therefore recommend that the permit be refused.

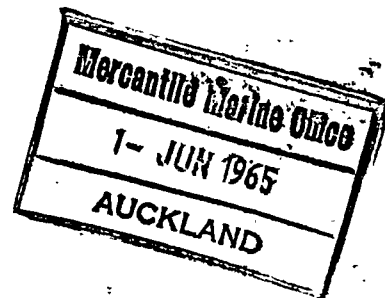

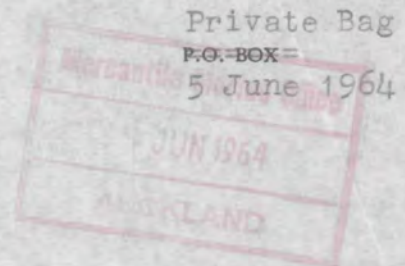

Reference your 14/4(1) of 11 May I have to advise that an inspection was made of the job by my Resident Engineer on 20 May in the company of Mr C.A. McCall Senior, and his son Mr I.K. McCall and the following points were noted:-

1. The County maintain they have taken a maximum of 1500 yds from the beach since December 1963. Mr McCall is sceptical and says the amount is much greater than this. From the appearance of the beach it is probable that the County's figure is correct.
2. Mr McCall has greatly exaggerated the present position. As yet little damage has been done to his beach or the boat harbour. He admits the access channel has been deepened to his benefit. However the spit which ran out and formed a bar across the mouth of the stream has been largely removed.
3. As the littoral drift is in a Northerly direction it is felt that in the event of heavy weather the shingle removed by the County would be replaced by shingle from in front of Mr McCall's flat land immediately to the south of the creek. The situation is worsened by the unusually dry year so far experienced there being no "freshes" to bring shingle down the Papa Aroha creek.
4. In conclusion it appears that to take large quantities of shingle from the area immediately would be detrimental to the area and this should be opposed. However if say 1000 to 2000 c.yds were taken from the stream or the area immediately in front of the stream, leaving the protecting spit untouched, it would have no serious effect on the main beach and would soon be replaced in the winter freshes. The Coromandel County has great need of cheap metal in this area for roading, and there is very little rateable land to pay for it. Hence even if some slight damage to the foreshore were to occur I consider that it would still be a reasonable proposition. " Probably the best solution would be as previously arranged i.e. the County to have permission to take 50 c.yds per month if required. This would normally be maintained by the gravel from the stream. "

1. The following is a copy of a letter received from the Coromandel County Council:

"My Council is desirous of obtaining road metal from the outlet of the Rauporoa Stream which parallels a short County road leading from the main Colville road to the beach at Papa Aroha.

The adjoining land is owned by the McCall family and members of this family claim riparian rights over the sea front and stream.

Permission is sought to take metal from the stream (which is obstructing the free flow of water) and also from the continual build-up on the beach front at the end of the Council road.

The exact position regarding riparian rights is not on record in this office, and there is no desire to infringe on individual rights. Could you please clarify the position and grant approval for Council to extract some 6,000 cubic yards of this desirable shingle for urgent road construction in the locality? Mr McCall Senr. is not in favour of the removal of shingle for fear of tempting erosion to his property on D.P. 12108. In the writer's view, this danger does not exist provided that the stream bed and road reserve only are used for winning shingle deposits."

2. We hold considerable correspondence on file concerning this foreshore, and it appears that in the past quite large quantities of shingle have been removed, at time apparently to the detriment of the surrounding property.

3. The following is an extract from a report of a survey made of all Auckland beaches by Mr. W.L. Bell, District Engineer, of the Ministry of Works, during 1950:-

Papa Aroha Beach:

This beach although closed to the removal of shingle by barge is at present open for the purpose of making available limited supplies of shingle for local purposes and permits are at present issued up to a limit of 50 cubic yards in any one month. The 1911 report indicated that supplies of shingle were available and the 1923 report stated that considerable quantities had been removed for years and the opinion was expressed that the beach "will always make up again." At the same time it was admitted that the beach was at a considerably lower level than hitherto.

When comparing present conditions with those shown on the photograph taken on the occasion of the 1911 inspection, it was noted that quite substantial alterations to the foreshore contour had taken place, no doubt as the result of the substantial removals referred to. A




camping ground has been established on the low fertile flat adjoining the beach and therefore good reasons exists to restrict any activities which would tend to slow up the rate of recovery of the beach. Furthermore, the littoral drift at this point of the coast is towards the north and the shingle coming down the Papa Aroha Creek should be allowed to travel naturally northwards and so make up the wastage by wave action on the foreshore to Amodeo Bay, to which point the road to Colville is located on a rocky ledge above the beach, the maintenance of the foreshore alignment being essential for the stability of the difficult 2 miles of road formation.

Although there appears a good case for closing the beach, under existing conditions there appears no reasonable alternative but to allow shingle to be taken from this locality for essential local requirements, but the beach should not be exploited for any comprehensive works and the restriction of 50 cubic yards per month should be permitted to give a temporary source of supply until such time as quarries are established in the district. In discussing this question with the County Council officials it was understood that there is a prospect of one or two quarries being developed in the Coromandel area. In any case the position should be carefully reviewed periodically and it is recommended that an officer of the Works Department visit the beach at least once in every year for the purpose of checking on the activities of licensees and the effect of the removal of shingle as permitted. It was noted that under the existing permits shingle was being taken from the neck of the spit adjacent to the mouth of the creek. If this practice is continued there is every prospect of the creek cutting a new channel through the beach which would in all probability affect the adjacent foreshore alignment. Licensees should therefore be notified that shingle should be taken only from the nose or tip of the spit."

4. From our records, very little shingle has been removed during the last ten years.

5. Would you please inspect this area, and if necessary discuss the question of removing 6,000 cubic yards with Mr M.O. Anstiss, the County Engineer, and then forward your recommendations to this office.

6. You will note that the question of riparian rights has been raised by Mr McCall, Senr. We have no evidence that Mr McCall holds these rights, and in any case they would only give him the right of access to the foreshore. We are communicating further with him in this matter, and will advise you in due course.

In reply to your letter of 31<sup>st</sup> August 1960 I have to advise that I have made full investigation into the taking of shingle from the above area.

First, I interviewed Mr. Holthorn, local carriers, who told me the shingle was being removed by truck.

I then interviewed Mr. C. Rae, the only other local carrier, who told me he had been taking shingle from Paparoa at high water mark adjacent to the stream, but had taken very little.

I then visited the place mentioned and noticed wheel marks and a hole dug at H.W.S.T. This I understand is Council property. There appears to be no removal below H.W. 6 O'clock. and in my 3½ years here I have not observed any barges, scows, or tow boats in this area.
