WHONGARAHI STREAM - COROMANDEL SHINGLE REMOVAL

Reference your 47/16 of 5 November 1980.

Prior to 1977 this stream had regularly had metal removed from it by Mr K Roberts and/or Mr B Little.

These metal removal operations, which had been going on for some 20 years or more had helped keep the stream bed free of natural blockages i.e. shingle bars, trees brought down during storms etc. This kept the over topping of the river banks to a minimum during storms.

However, since these operations stopped, the river has broken its banks on a number of occasions causing considerable damage to a number of hourse on Hauraki Road.

I inspected the site of the Council's latest shingle removal operation in the stream and found the stream bed and stop banks had been tidied

My recommendations are that the Thames-Coromandel District Council be allowed to remove shingle from the section of stream providing the work is done in a tidy manner and the stream is always left safe after the completion of any work done by the Council.

The Hauraki Catchment Board's area office concurs with my recommendations and agrees that these shingle removal operations greatly benefit land owners adjacent to the stream.

In previous applications for shingle removal this section of the Whongarahi Stream has been referred to as Furegy's Creek.



Further to the telephone conversation le Marquand/Vincent of 18th July 1980, I confirm that over recent years the above stream has burst its banks several times per year, flooding houses in Hauraki Road and Albert Street. A factor contributing to the flooding is the build up of shingle banks in the river. We have removed some of the shingle as an emergency measure, but consider that regular removal of the shingle is necessary to maintain the stream waterway. The length over which we wish to remove the shingle is tidal, hence this request is directed at your department.

Benefits could be gained by removing shingle over the length from the stream mouth on the Coromandel Harbour to a point about 700m upstream from the bridge across Wharf Road, on a regular basis.

The Council has been approached by residents of Greys Beach, Kuaotunu, regarding a threat to existing mature pohutukawa trees on the beach presumed to be caused by shingle extraction operations.

Residents suggest that the shingle extraction has left the roots of at least two mature trees exposed, and that the trees are in danger of falling unless some remedial action is taken. If the trees fall, the road above will be at peril from sea erosion.

The Council's Area Engineer and riding member are investigating the to confirm that in their opinion there is damage attributable to shingle extraction, and I will advise you of their comments in due course.

Would you please advise:

- 1. If the damage can be attributed to the shingle extraction, what powers exist to have the licencee put right the damage.
- What responsibility your Department accepts for overseeing operations 2. of shingle licence holders.
- Who can Council hold liable for reinstatement work. 3.

I note that Mr Le Marquand will be in the area on 30 April - 1 May and would appreciate if he could arrange to look at this area during his visit. If he would contact the Area Engineer, Bill Sloan at phone 65804 Whitianga, I am sure a joint visit could be arranged.

KUAOTUNU BEACH AND WHANGAPOUA HARBOUR ENTRANCE

Board has been asked to comment to the Resident Engineer, Ministry of Works and Development, Paeroa, on an application to extract sand from Kuaotunu Beach by Mr M.R. Hodge. Board's opinion is that sand extraction is likely to damage the beach but there is little information available at this stage. Board has resolved to oppose the removal of sand from any beach within its district in advance of adequate information, and suggests that your office fund a beach survey at Kuaotunu similar to that carried out for Whiritoa Beach. It is appreciated that funds are generally short, but Board's situation in respect of beaches in the former Coromandel County area is that, because this area is in Board's district for Regional Water Board purposes only, no monies whatsoever are available for soil conservation or river control purposes and this includes beaches and foreshore matters.

Should your office decide to issue a further licence in the meantime, the licence might well be informed that it might be necessary to terminate it before its expiry date.

The same comments would apply to the application of Messrs Parry Bros Ltd to remove sand from the Whangapoua Harbour entrance, except that, in this case, you might care to make reference to the Matarangi Beach report supplied to your office about two years ago on the occasion of the Town and Country Planning Appeal related to the proposed subdivision of the Whangapoua spit.

Board has received a copy of an application made by Mr M.R. Hodge of Kuaotunu for the extraction of sand from the Kuaotunu Beach. Board's opinion is that sand extraction is likely to damage the beach but there is little hard information available at this stage.

We will be supplying the Ministry of Transport with a copy of Board's policy on beaches, and will indicate that while sand extraction is probably adversely affecting the beach, this can only be ascertained by an investigation similar to that recently conducted for the Whiritoa Beach. Board will suggest that such an investigation should be put in hand immediately.

If a further licence is issued in the meantime, the taker of the sand should be informed that it might be necessary to terminate it before its expiry date.

The same comments would apply to the application of Messrs Parry Bros. Ltd to remove sand from the Whangapoua Harbour entrance.
