

#### THAMES HARBOUR - SLIPWAY WIDENING

Approval is sought, in terms of Section 178 (b) of the Harbours Act, for the widening of the Thames harbour slipway. Enclosed in duplicate are drawings detailing the proposal.

The two un-numbered drawings show the existing slipway while drawings 1-75001-1, 2 detail the proposed widening of a further 3m, i.e. total width of 6m. Drawing 1-71004-2 shows the location of the existing slipway. The structure is to be widened on the northwestern side to allow larger vessels the use of the haul out facilities.

Work on the widening of the slipway has already commenced with driving of piles and precasting concrete caps and slab.



POLICY ON RECLAMATION

Your letter of 12 August 1981 refers and I apologise for the delay in replying.

An application for the building of a structure or reclamation over foreshore within your Council's jurisdiction should be forwarded by the applicant for prior consideration before Council forwards the plans to this Ministry for approval pursuant to the provisions of the Harbours Act 1950. However, there are times when applications are forwarded direct to this Ministry. When this happens this Ministry acknowledges receipt of the applications and advises the applicants that it has forwarded the application to Council for Council's consideration prior to any action being taken by the Ministry. The Council when it has given its support to an application would refer that application and plans to the Auckland Regional Office of the Ministry for consideration in terms of section 178 of the Act.

In respect of reclamations, the procedure which is followed by this Ministry is that close consultation is maintained with the Grant of Control authority and any comments made by that authority would be carefully considered when the Ministry decides the degree of support or otherwise that would be given to a proposal. The Ministry would not give its approval to any reclamation without first consulting the grant of control authority.

Concerning works carried out by the Crown, in the particular use in question, the Ministry of Works and Development in disposing of surplus clay material from roadworks the position is different from that already discussed. The Crown is not bound by the provisions of the Harbours Act 1950 and therefore legally no approval is required to be obtained for the Crown to carry out works over foreshore or tidal lands.

The Ministry has for some time recognised that Government works should achieve the same standard that is required of local authorities and others. This policy, which follows from departments' obligations under the Environmental Protection and Enhancement Procedures established by Cabinet in 1973, has been endorsed by the Minister of Transport. In 1978, the Secretary for Transport wrote to the Permanent Heads of all Departments engaged in foreshore works and advised that plans of such works should be forwarded to the Ministry for consideration pursuant to section 178 of the Act. Therefore the tenure of the Harbours act should be complied with by all Government Departments.

It is obvious that certain problems arise in respect of the disposal of spoil within the area administered by your Council and to have this matter clarified, I have forwarded a copy of your letter of 12 August to the Auckland Office of this Ministry and have asked that the matter be taken up with the Ministry of Works and Development accordingly.

In answer to your specific questions I advise as follows:

- 1. This Ministry would appreciate advice of any illegal reclamation which come to Council's attention. The Harbours Act provides for remedies to be taken including prosecution or removal.
- 2. Yes. Where an application for any work is received, this Ministry will consult with Council as discussed above.
- 3. Yes, refer above.
- 4. No. The Harbours Act does not provide for general authorisations in the form discussed nor does it allow for approvals in principle.
- 5. An officer from the Auckland Office of this Ministry will be asked to meet with the Ministry of Works and Development to discuss the matters raised.
- Answered above:

I trust that the above information is of assistance to you in your administration of the foreshore and tidal waters in terms of the Grant of Control.



Your letter of 7 April refers.

The Council has noted your comments regarding the reclamation at Tairua. This work occurred when the old Paku jetty was demolished and the volunteers who carried out the demolition were apparently a little more enthusiastic than good sense would allow and placed the demolition materials from the job in this area to give a flying start to the reclamation proposed.

The Council would apologise for this happening before the formal application was made, and will take action to put the matter right.

The District Scheme has now been notified and the proposals to reclaim portion of the harbour at this point have now been made public.

I am having a formal application prepared to reclaim at this point in a manner which will compliment the future planning intentions for this area. The reclamation will not be particularly extensive and it will give an opportunity for meeting the vehicle parking needs and reserve areas adjacent to the beach at this point.

This reclamation is not designed to promote the Tairua-Pauanui Deep Sea Fishing Club's building proposal but rather to improve the public beach front facility at this point. With this application there will be a proposal to form the foreshore road, which is currently affected by strong tides and high seas in the harbour, to a level suitably high above the sea level to allow vehicle access to those properties fronting the harbour which previously have been unable to gain access.

The proposal will include a walkway which will link the Pepe area with the primary school along the beach front.

I am sorry that the dumping was carried out and I trust that this error will not prejudice the Council's case for a beach improvement project in this vicinity.






